SIGNS OF SPRING – FIRST PASTURE WALKS




Granite State Graziers held their first pasture walk of the season on April 14th in Tamsworth, NH at the Remick Country Doctor Museum and Farm. Kim Meader spoke on the genetics of various species, including cattle, swine and goats, and gave a demonstration of preparing a specimen for insemination.
